- The psychology minor is available to undergraduate students from any college at MU. Students interested in the psychology minor should come to 100 McAlester Hall during non-registration walk-in hours to see an Academic Advisor to complete the paperwork for the minor. Students do **NOT** need to have all of the minor courses completed prior to completing the minor form.

Effective March 2000, to receive a minor in psychology a student must complete the following coursework. Pre-FS04 course numbers are noted in parentheses.

- **Psychology 1000 (1): General Psychology** (3 hours)
- **Three regularly-scheduled psychology courses** (9 hours) At least two of these courses must be numbered 3000-level (formerly 200-level) or above. "Regularly-scheduled" includes all courses except Psych 4950: Special Problems (300), Psych 4960: Special Readings (350), and Psych 4976/4977: Honors Capstone Lab (398/399). Note: Psych 2950 (formerly Psych 200) did not become a 3000-level course with the renumbering; so this course obviously cannot be used to meet one of the two 3000-level course requirement.
- **Additional psychology course(s)** (Usually 3 hours)
- The total hours of course credit in psychology must be 15 hours or greater.

- To earn the psychology minor, students must have at least a 2.00 GPA in the required courses. Students must receive a grade of "C" or better in all courses required for the minor. Grades of "C-" will not be accepted. Pass/fail graded courses will not be accepted.

- A total of 6 hours of transfer and/or independent study course credit will be accepted toward the minor.

- Statistics 1300 (31) cannot be counted toward the minor.

- Students cannot use non-regularly-scheduled courses (i.e., Psych 4950/4960/4976/4977) to complete the "two courses numbered 3000 or above" requirement. Students can use non-regularly-scheduled courses to count as additional psychology courses toward the 15 hours needed for the minor. For example, Psych 1000/2410/2510/4950/3150 (formerly 1/170/180/300/279) would **NOT** work for the minor. Psych 1000/2410/4950/3150/3160 (formerly 1/170/300/279/293) **WOULD** work for the minor.
