- ✓ At least 30 of the last 36 hours of coursework for the degree must be MU coursework. MU courses taken through the Center for Distance and Independent Study (<http://cdis.missouri.edu>) are acceptable.
- ✓ After a student has completed 90 hours of coursework, only university-level coursework can transfer to MU (no community college coursework will be accepted).
- ✓ A maximum of 64 hours of credit from a community college can apply toward graduation. This credit can be earned at any time, as long as at least 30 of the final 36 hours are completed in MU coursework.
